I wanted to update you all on two very important things...

1. **Comp and Benefit Committee sent out a survey last night—the committee wants to hear from you! The survey will close on Friday, May 22. If you have not received it, please look in your spam/junk folder. If you are unable to locate it, please contact me and I will take care of it.**
2. **You all should have seen the most updated PD schedule that came from the district yesterday afternoon. This resulted from the work the OEA on your behalf. We heard you and provided solutions to the district. The changes have been made and you may now work the PD hours into your routines. To review:**
 - **You have 42 hours of PD to be completed from May 21-June 5. All sessions will be asynchronous, registration is NOT NEEDED. The ELA adoption must remain synchronous for the K-5 teachers; you should have already registered for these and they will NOT change.**
 - **You must take the required sessions from various departments as stated in the catalog. If you wish to do more from other areas, you can do that as well.**
 - **You will need to find time to collaborate with natural groupings. This could look different for everyone. Collaboration and planning could be with grade level team members, teachers in other buildings, department members or paraprofessionals. Your administration can request but not require for you to participate in a set collaboration time. However, you will be asked by the district to show how the 42 hours were used.**
 - **The PD sessions being offered will NOT be offered in the Fall, so take advantage of the offerings now.**
