Early Enrollment

- Early enrollment has begun and will run through August 31st.
- No Cost between April 1 and August 31, 2021
- Potential members can enroll now with limited benefits.
- Potential members who have been a student association member in the past, but are not yet an active member, are eligible for early enrollee membership.
- You will receive liability insurance from the date of signing. You will have access to member-only professional development opportunities offered by NSEA from the date of signing.
- You will have access to the services of NSEA staff to answer your questions. Full services begin when your contract for the 2021-2022 school year begins.
- Access to an attorney is NOT part of Early Enrollment benefits. Early Enrollment signees may have access to an attorney for incident that occurs when their contract for the 2021-2022 school year begins.


Insurance 101

About the Book:

From racist donut shops to strangers putting their whole hand in her hair, from being mistaken for a prostitute to being mistaken for Harriet Tubman, Lacey is a lightning rod for hilariously ridiculous yet all-too-real anecdotes. She's the perfect mix of polite, beautiful, petite, and Black that apparently makes people think "I can say whatever I want to this woman." And now, Amber and Lacey share these entertainingly horrifying stories through their laugh-out-loud sisterly banter. Painfully relatable or shockingly eye-opening (depending on how often you have personally been followed by security at department stores), this book tackles modern-day racism with the perfect balance of levity and gravity.

About the Authors:

Amber Ruffin is a writer and cast member on NBC's Late Night with Seth Meyers. She also amazingly became the first black woman to write for a late-night talk show in American history when she joined the staff in 2014, and was a writer/sometimes performer on HBO's Black Lady Sketch Show. She is about to launch her own late night show, The Amber Ruffin Show which will anchor the new NBC streaming service, Peacock.

Lacey Lamar is Amber Ruffin's big sister. She has worked in the healthcare and human service field for more than twenty-five years, thirteen of those working with troubled youth in her community. She volunteers her time and resources to black, brown refugee and indigenous fellow humans in any way she can. Lacey lives in Nebraska with her unbelievable amazing daughter Imani and their 130lb Great Dane Izzy.

Building AR Elections

As we are heading into the last few months of school, and with that comes the OEA building Association Representative election. This is an individual (s) who brings your building concerns to the monthly AR meetings and takes information back to your building and shares with the members. *Each school is entitled to one representative and one alternate. Schools or departments having more than 15 OEA members are entitled to one representative and one alternate for each additional 15 members or major fraction thereof.*

For example: A school with 23 members would be entitled to two ARs (15 = first AR, +8 (a major fraction of 15) = second AR). The position of Primary Contact shall be determined by secret ballot of current association representatives. In the event of a tie, or no one has been nominated for the position of Captain, the members in said building will conduct a separate ballot to determine who is Captain from among the elected association representatives. The AR alternates would assist the ARs and attend AR Assembly, especially in the absence of the Captain or an AR.

This election should be completed by **Tuesday, May 11th**. Please consider running for an AR position
