

Colleagues-

You are officially back to school, preparing for the arrival of your students who you haven't seen in five months. No one knows what it will look like, but teachers will find a way to make their classrooms welcoming, student centered, and ready for the learning to start.

As you are begin to meet in your buildings, questions are asked and OEA is answering.

Can I remove my mask if I am in my room by myself?

• Yes, if the door is shut and you are alone. If someone comes in, you need to place the mask back on.

What happens when students don't wear a mask?

• Each building is left to identify the steps in reteaching the students on wearing a mask. It should be identified in your MTSS-B plan, with teacher input. It should not be punitive, but a reteaching opportunity.

Our building doesn't have hand sanitizer, wipes, spray bottles, or masks.

• These items have begun to be delivered starting August 4th. There are no wipes, there is disinfectant spray and pa per towels that are being used. Spray bottles are being collected for this purpose and delivered to the buildings. If you do not have them, ask your Principal if the materials have arrived. If you are told that the items are not there, let me know and we will ask about specific buildings. All items should be in the buildings/classrooms by Friday.

Is it 3 feet or 6 feet in distance from others?

• OPS has been working with UNMC directly; their guideline is 6 feet. It's 6 feet.

If the district decides against fall sports, will I still be compensated?

This is same as spring sports. If you are designated as a coach, you will be compensated accordingly.

What if a student test positive for COVID?

• According to HIPPA, the identity of the student will not be disclosed. Once a student has been identified, OPS and DCH will work with UNMC on tracing. They will contact the family; they will then notify those students who sat in proximity of possible exposure. If needed they will then notify others on the status. My suggestion is that you keep a detailed seating chart for each group of students. Also, keep in mind that you should not disclose the student names to anyone. You can ask questions for your safety and follow the needed protocols, but this should never be brought into any discussion with other teachers.

Can I decline covering for a class?

• No, the district has the right of assignment. I would suggest having a building plan to be implemented in the event staff are asked to cover. Work with your administration to identify any concerns you may have.

If we go full remote, when will we know?

• The district has been working closely with DCH and UNMC and monitoring numbers every day. The numbers continue to rise, and multiple plans are being adapted each day. I know teachers are planners, take one day at a time. Many individuals are working extremely hard on behalf of students and staff.

I was given a remote teaching position, but no further details.

• Keep in mind this is something new and being developed as the days go by. You will be contacted by Ms. Leah Weeks. Direct all inquiries to her, but understand things change.

So, what can we do?

The district has been the leader when compared to surrounding areas. OPS knew that 100% in person instruction could not happen, so they started with the 3:2 Family Plan and have done a good job identifying ways to make it work for students, staff and the community. Has it brought additional questions? Yes, and they are being addressed.
OPS sent a letter to the DCH and Omaha City Council urging a mask mandate. The mask mandate is now in the hands of the Omaha City Council. I would like you to contact your city council representative and ask them to vote YES for this mandate on Tuesday. Their email addresses are below.
