• Early enrollment has begun and will run through August 31st.

• No Cost between April 1 and August 31, 2022.

• Potential members can enroll now with limited benefits.

• Potential members who have been a student association member (Aspiring Educators) in the past, but are not yet an active member, are eligible for early enrollment membership.

• You will receive liability insurance from the date of signing. They will have access to member-only professional development opportunities offered by NSEA from the date of signing.

• You will have access to the services of NSEA staff to answer your questions. Full services begin when your contract for the 2022-2023 school year begins.

• Access to an attorney is NOT part of Early Enrollment benefits. Early Enrollment signees may have access to an attorney for incident that occurs when their contract for the 2022-2023 school year begins.

Reach out to your fellow colleagues who have been considering joining, those who are student teaching or even the new hires that have been identified. They will pay NOTHING until October 2022!


