Let's just cut to the chase

As we prepare to enter negotiations for the 2023-24 school year, I want to share some significant information with you.

We have heard from members that additional teacher planning days are needed. OEA will be strongly advocating for additional teacher planning time in the coming negotiations; however, district administration has made it very clear that they are watching the attendance on Teacher Planning and Professional Development days and will not grant future days based on the current trend of absences.

There are two such days scheduled for next week: October 31 and November 1, and I urge you to use those days according to the contract and calendar for PD and Teacher Planning.

As a teacher myself, I understand the lure of taking leave on nonstudent days to fulfill medical and other appointments. You may have the desire to avoid the need for a substitute or for a colleague to have to take on your classes; however, we cannot advocate for more teacher planning time if educators are not taking advantage of the planning time that is already provided to them. *And please remember that it is the district's responsibility – not yours – to secure a substitute when*

necessary.

I urge you to consider the long-term value of being in attendance during nonstudent days.

I encourage you to take the time to do what you need to do to ease that stress and take a night or two and the weekend off from school.
